

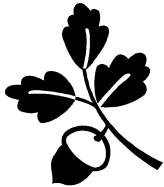

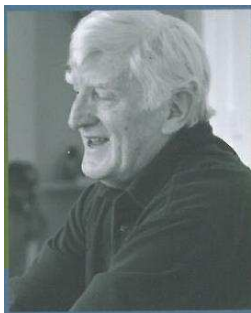

Bruce Duncan was ordained for the Redemptorist Congregation in 1971. To specialise in the areas of social justice, he studied economics and political science at the University of Sydney. Since 1986 he has taught at Yarra Theological Union, and coordinates the program in social justice studies. He was a member of the Melbourne Catholic Commission for Justice, Development and Peace (1994-2007), and a consultant with Catholic Social Services Victoria (1998-2007). He is one of the founders of the advocacy organisation, Social Policy Connections, and of the new Yarra Institute for Religion and Social Policy, of which he is the Director.



Kevin Peoples was a leader in the YCW in the 1950's and an organiser for the National Catholic Rural Movement from 1959 – 1961. He has recently published his memoir entitled *Santamaria's Salesman*, covering this brief period in the history of the Movement. In it he paints a compelling picture of life in the Australian Church and society in the 1950's and 60's. Born in the Western District, Kevin now lives in Melbourne with his wife, Margaret. A retired TAFE Teacher, Kevin has an MA in Australian History from the University of Melbourne.
